Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is **option 3** i.e. **scratch**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

- scratch**- to rub your skin with your nails, especially because it is irritating you (itching).
- deep**- going a long way down from the surface.
- scrape**- to remove something from a surface by moving a sharp edge across it firmly.
- shallow**- not deep; with not much distance between top and bottom.
- From scratch**- from the very beginning.

'From scratch' is an idiom hence, it gives the correct meaning to the paragraph hence, it will suit the blank.

Q:2 The correct answer is **option 2** i.e. **benchmarked**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

- benchmarked**- evaluate (something) by comparison with a standard.
- gauged**- to make a judgement or to calculate something by guessing.
- measured**- marked by due proportion.
- guided**- led by a guide.
